Patient Experiences:

d/Deaf Patients

Healthwatch Warrington was initially approached by Signing Solutions to discuss the issues that the d/Deaf community in Warrington are experiencing with Hospital access.

Utilising the Warrington Deaf Centre and its members, along with Signing Solutions we were able to speak to the d/Deaf community in a place where they felt comfortable and have qualified British Sign Language (BSL) interpreters on hand to hear the patient's views and feedback to us exactly what they wanted to say.

Healthwatch Warrington analysed the data and collated it to create the report. This is an independent report and using the feedback from those d/Deaf patients we made recommendations based on this.
